
Penang

A mix of old & new - of East & West, Penang's variety is hard to beat. From the highrises of it's capital, Georgetown, to the century old church, Chinese and Indian temples and mosques, the melding of the many faces and places in Penang is best reflected in the aromatic hawker stalls at Guerney Drive. When beaches beckon, Batu Ferringhi provides the resorts and facilities for rest and relaxation.

Langkawi

Offering some of the world's best kept secrets – secluded coves and long stretches of white sandy beaches -Langkawi is an escape from the hustle of city life. Warm and calm, with easily accessible natural attractions, the islands of Langkawi are a stunning showcase. Myths and legends abound, interwoven with culture and folklore. Superb resorts and facilities provide a haven for lovers of tropical hideaways.





Travel tips

Climate: Peninsula Malaysia has a tropical climate with warm weather all year round.

Temperatures range from 21°C to 32°C. Rainfall varies throughout the year, with the wettest months from September to November.

Currency: Money can be changed at banks or Money Changers found in major shopping centres. \$1AUD is equal to approximately 2.75 Malaysian Ringgit.

Travellers cheques and most credit cards are accepted at all hotels, major department stores and restaurants.

Visas: Visitors to Malaysia must be in possession of a valid passport with a minimum validity of 6 months beyond the period of stay. Most nationalities do not require a visa for social or business visits if staying less than 60 days. It's best to check with your travel agent on what may apply to you prior to departure.

Tipping: Most hotels and restaurants levy a 10% Service Charge and 6% GST on bills, therefore tipping is not customary.

What to Wear: Light summer clothes are best for the warm, humid climate. Sandals or walking shoes are necessary for rainforest trails. When visiting mosques & places of worship it is polite to cover your shoulders and knees.

Health: No vaccinations are required. Malaria treatment is not required unless spending time in remote and seldom visited areas. We suggest you contact your own physician or travel doctor for your own circumstances.

Food: Try it all! You can learn a great deal about a country and its people from the food they serve and eat. A diverse range of Malaysian curries, local fruits and vegetables found in no other place. Most eateries operate until late at night. Western food is also readily available at resorts and many restaurants.

Electricity: 240V and a UK flat 3-pin plug is used.

Shopping: Most retail outlets have a fixed price for their goods, however bargaining is most common at night markets or at bazaars. Shopping centres operate mostly from 10am to 10pm.



Countryside & Batu Caves


Rural sights and handicraft

Duration: 3 hours Departure: 9.30am & 2.30pm daily

A trip to the outskirts along the 'Ambassador Row', Istana Sharif Ali, Malay villages. Stop at Royal Selangor Pewter. See the processes of casting, filing, polishing, soldering, hammering and engraving. Visit the batik factory.

Proceed to Batu Caves and visit Temple Cave and Museum Cave filled with images depicting scenes from the Hindu scriptures.

Note: Wear comfortable walking shoes.



City Tour

Metropolitan landmarks

Duration: 3 hours

Departure: 9.30am & 2.30pm daily

A must for first time visitors to KL showing the beauty and charm of the old and new. See the contrast of the magnificent skyscrapers to the buildings of the colonial day. Highlights: Petronas Twin Towers (photo stop), OE jewellery showroom, King's Palace (photo stop), National Monument, National Museum (exclude entrance fee), National Mosque (photo stop) and Sultan Abdul Samad Building.



Historical Malacca

More than 580 years of history

Duration: 8 hours Departure: 9.30am daily

Visit St. Peter's Church, the oldest Christian church still in use in Malaysia. Drive past the largest 17th century Chinese cemetery outside of China.

Stop at the foothills to view the Sultan's Well before driving through the Portuguese settlement. View the famous gateway, 'Porta de Santiago' and the ruins of St. Paul's Church, Red Square, Christchurch, Cheng Hoon Teng Temple and take a stroll along Malacca's Jonker Street.



National Zoo & School of Hard Knocks

Fun and educational

Duration: 6 hours Departure: 9.30am daily

Spread across 110 acres, the Malaysian Zoo and the Tunku Abdul Rahman Aquarium feature over 400 species of local exotic mammals, reptiles, fish and birds.

The Pewter Gallery has interactive displays and exhibits. The highlight of the tour is the 'School of Hard Knocks'. A pewter smith guides you through the processes of forming, scraping and polishing. The finished dish, a certificate and apron are your momentos for keeps.



Fireflies & Kuala Selangor

Duration: 8 hours

Departure: 3.30pm daily Proceed to Kampung Kuantan

to enjoy the trip in a small unmotorised boat in the quiet darkness to witness the blinking trees of the largest firefly colonies in the world.

Note: Please bring along insect repellent.

A day of thrills and spills

Duration: 6 hours Departure: 9.30am daily

Enroute visit a Leather and Batik showroom, stop at Petronas Twin Towers for photos. Enjoy the many thrilling rides and slides at Sunway Lagoon at your own leisure. Sunway Lagoon Theme Park is divided into major themed sections - Wildlife Park, Extreme Park, Scream park, World of Adventure, Wild Wild West and the all-new Waters of Africa.

Note: Bring along your towel & swim wear. Closed: Tuesdays (except school and public holidays)



A Day in the Rainforest

Fun and educational.

Duration: 5.5 hours Departure: 9.30am Mon-Thurs

Experience a tropical rainforest within the city limits of Kuala Lumpur! Pass through typical Malay villages, see local villagers going about with their daily chores and visit an aboriginal family.

At the lodge, your guide will identify various fruit trees and show some of the activities and games played by local villagers. Test your shooting skills with a blowpipe, fish with a bamboo pole and swim in a running stream and pool in lush tropical surroundings.

Tours are managed as a small group adventure. Minimum 2 passengers.

Mini Stays

Pick up from and return to your Kuala Lumpur Hotel



Day 1: Kuala Lumpur/Malacca Pick up from your hotel and dri

Pick up from your hotel and drive to Malacca. Visit St. Peter's Church – the oldest Christian church still in use in Malaysia. Drive past the largest 17th century Chinese cemetery outside of China and stop at the foothills to view the Sultan's Well before driving through the Portuguese Settlement.

Proceed to view the famous gateway, "Porta De Santiago" and the ruins of St. Paul's Church lined by 17th century Dutch tombstones. Then "Red Square", Christchurch and the "Abode Merciful Clouds" or the Cheng Hoon Teng Temple – the only temple where you can find 3 major doctrines of local Chinese belief under the same roof – Taoism, Buddhism and Confucianism.

Return to Holiday Inn Malacca for dinner and overnight. (L/D)

Day 2: Malacca/ Kuala Lumpur

Take a stroll along Malacca's Jonker Street, which ends by the banks of the Malacca River before transfer back to Kuala Lumpur in afternoon. (B)



Cameron Highlands

Duration: 3 days/2 nights Tour Code: KLM005 Departure: 8am daily

Day 1: Kuala Lumpur – Cameron Highlands Depart your hotel in Kuala Lumpur to Cameron Highlands (approx. 4 hours). Check in to Heritage Hotel. Overnight at Heritage Hotel. (L/D)

Day 2: Tea Plantations / Farm & Markets

Depart hotel to visit BOH tea plantation

and go for the factory tour to see how tea leaf is processed. The highland was first founded in 1885 by Sir William Cameron, a British Government surveyor, while on a mapping expedition. With the cool climate, it became the perfect place to grow tea and vegetables. Return to hotel.

In the afternoon, visit to the farm and markets place selling local produce. Take a walk along Kea Farm, the whole area is just one big market garden. Many of the vegetables supplied in Malaysia and to Singapore are grown here. Besides vegetables, flowers like roses, dried flowers and small potted plants are commonly seen in the market. Return to hotel. Overnight Heritage Hotel. (B/L/D)

Day 3: Cameron Highlands – Kuala Lumpur

Jungle walk for 1.5 hours. After lunch, return to Kuala Lumpur. Drop off at hotel or at the airport. (B/L)



Colonial Malaysia

5 days / 4 nights

Tour Code: KCM01

Tour commences in Kuala Lumpur and finishes in Penang. Tours depart daily. Includes all accommodation, meals as indicated, park entrance fees, English speaking local guide. Minimum 2 passengers.



<mark>Day 1</mark> Kuala Lumpur – Malacca

Hotel pick up and drive to Malacca (2 hours). Check in and lunch at Renaissance Malacca. After lunch, take a Malacca city tour including the Stadthuys (town house) – built in 1650 for the Dutch governors and officers, the museums of History, Ethnography and Literature and St. Paul's Church. Enjoy a walk along Jonker Street, popular for its antique shops. Dinner and overnight Malacca Renaissance Hotel. (L,D)

Day 2

Temples & Mosques / River Boat Ride

This morning we tour Malacca's temples and mosques, including the oldest place of worship in Malacca, the Tranguerah Mosque, Malaysia's oldest Chinese Temple, Chen Hoon Teng which dates back to 1646, the Anglican Christ Church and the Roman Catholic St. Peter's Church. In the afternoon enjoy a scenic boat ride along Malacca River where once merchant ships came from India, China and Arabia to trade their textiles and silk for spices and scented woods. Overnight Malacca Renaissance Hotel. (B,L,D)

Day 3

Malacca - Cameron Highlands

Depart Malacca to Cameron Highlands (5 hours). Check in to Heritage Hotel. Free at leisure till dinner. Overnight Heritage Hotel. (B,L,D)

Day 4

Tea Plantations / Farm & Markets

Visit BOH tea plantation. The cool climate makes this area perfect for growing tea and vegetables. Tour the factory to see how tea leaf is processed. After lunch, proceed to the farm



and marketplace. Take a walk along Kea Farm, a market garden with vegetables, dried and fresh flowers and small potted plants. Dinner and overnight Heritage Hotel. (B,L,D)

Day 5

Cameron Highlands - Penang

Leave the Cameron Highlands for the royal town of Kuala Kangsar (approx 2 hours). On arrival, make a short stop at Ubudiah Mosque then visit the Royal Museum. Tour the old colonial town before heading for Taiping (approx. 30 mins) where we lunch at a Chinese restaurant before visiting Lake Gardens, a Commonwealth War Memorial and the Perak Museum. Depart for Penang, drop off at your hotel or the airport. (B,L)

Round Malaysia Tour



7 days / 6 nights

Tour commences and finishes in Kuala Lumpur. Tours depart every Saturday. Includes all accommodation, meals as indicated, park entrance fees, English speaking local guide. Minimum 2 passengers.



Day 1 (Saturday) Kuala Lumpur - Cameron Highlands

Depart for Cameron Highland, noted for its tea plantations and cool climate. Stop on the way basket weaving, Lata Iskandar Waterfall and a native settlement. Tour of Cameron Highlands consists of the tea plantation, tea factory, market place and butterfly farm. Overnight.

Day 2 (Sunday) Cameron Highlands - Penang

En route to Penang visit the Sam Poh Tong cave temple, Kuala Kangsar, Ubudiah Mosque, Istana Iskandariah, Istana Kenangan and Kuala Sepetang mangrove forest. Visit a charcoal kiln and cross over to Penang, the "Pearl of the Orient" via Penang Bridge. (B)

Day 3 (Monday) Discovery Tour of Georgetown, Penang

City, Culture, and Heritage tour of Georgetown, a UNESCO SITE. Visit the reclining Buddha and Kek Lok Si Temple. Next, Fort Cornwallis, the landing site of Captain Francis Light in 1786, The Clan Jetties at Weld Quay and "The Street of Harmony" with its churches, Chinese & Hindu temples and mosques. Visit the intricate Khoo Kong Si clan's house. Enjoy a trishaw ride. Late evening, explore the nightlife along Batu Ferringhi, Penang style! (B)

Day 4 (Tuesday) Penang - Kota Bharu

Travel East across Peninsular Malaysia through the main mountain range. Stop on Banding Island for a view of the Temenggor Lake. On arrival in Kelantan, proceed to the border town of Rantau Panjang, a meeting and trading point for people of Thailand and Malaysia before Kota Bahru. (B)

Day 5 (Wednesday) Kota Bharu – Terengganu

Start the day with a visit to the colourful wet market of Kota Bharu and the traditional cottage industries such as silver handicraft and songket weaving. Drive along the scenic coastline south to Kuala Terengganu, tasting some keropok, local chips made of fish or prawn. Day at own leisure. (B)

Day 6 (Thursday) Terengganu – Kuantan

Head towards Kuantan with a stop in Kuala Terengganu, famous for its traditional boat making. Visit the Islamic Civilization Park. Continue to a brassware centre. Head South towards Cherating, stopping at a fishing village and turtle information centre. Taste the "lemang"rice, a popular Malay delicacy and enjoy afternoon tea hosted by the local community. (B)

Day 7 (Friday) Kuantan – Kuala Lumpur Overland to Kuala Lumpur. (B)

Taman Negara Explorer Tour



4 days/3 nights

Tour commences and finishes in Kuala Lumpur. Departs daily. Includes all land & river transfers, English speaking guide in Taman Negara, accommodation, meals as stated and tours as stated. Min 2 passengers.



Day 1 Kuala Lumpur – Taman Negara National Park

Pick up from your hotel, drive to Kuala Tembeling Jetty and then boat to Taman Negara National Park. After dinner, an introduction by your guide and video of Taman Negara before a night walk. Overnight Mutiara Taman Negara. (D)

Day 2 Taman Negara National Park

After breakfast, proceed on a 2km jungle trek to the canopy walkway and Teresek Hill. You are back at the Mutiara for lunch and then enjoy a boat cruise to Lake Berkoh, a great swimming location in a natural landscape. Overnight Mutiara Taman Negara. (B,L,D)

Day 3 Taman Negara National Park

This morning explore Ear Cave and its spectacular rock formations and natural wildlife. In the afternoon, a little excitement shooting the river rapids to Kuala Trenggan. Overnight Mutiara Taman Negara. (B,L,D)

Day 4 Return to Kuala Lumpur

After breakfast, depart by boat to Kuala Tembeling Jetty and drive to Kuala Lumpur, returning to your hotel approx 1600. (B)
