The conference opened with a welcome address by **Dr. Kashan Pirzada**, Chairman of the GATR Advisory Board, who emphasized the timely relevance of the conference themes to contemporary developments in business and social sciences research. After warmly greeting participants from around the world, he expressed sincere appreciation for their valuable



and shared his vision for the event to serve as an effective platform for establishing new academic collaborations and professional networks. Dr. Pirzada highlighted the conference's potential to foster meaningful connections that would advance research and practice across these disciplines, setting an optimistic and collaborative tone for the proceedings.

The conference then welcomed plenary speaker Professor Dr. Gabriel A. Moens (Curtin

University and Emeritus Professor, University of Queensland, Australia), who delivered a thought-provoking address on 'The Importance of Academic Freedom and the Rule of Law for Research.' While the value of academic freedom is widely acknowledged, Professor Moens highlighted its underrepresentation in scholarly discourse, emphasizing its dependence on a robust

discourse, emphasizing its dependence on a robust

Rule of Law framework. His analysis revealed the precarious state of academic freedom in modern universities and examined how interpretations of the Rule of Law vary across cultural and national contexts, directly impacting research ecosystems. This critical exploration underscored the need to protect these interdependent principles as foundations for global academic progress.

Professor Istemi Demirag (University of Keele, UK) presented his study 'Management Control Issues in PPP Contracts,' employing Foucault's governmentality framework to analyze accounting's role in shaping the UK's Private Finance Initiative (PFI). Through critical discourse analysis of official UK government documents (1992–2012) from HM Treasury, the



National Audit Office, and Parliamentary committees, his research revealed a paradox: while PFI offered a solution to infrastructure funding gaps amid strict departmental borrowing constraints, accounting mechanisms were strategically used by successive governments to **construct, justify, and**

implement PFI rationales. This work highlights how technical accounting practices become tools of **political governance** in public-private partnerships.

Prior to the closing ceremony, Professor Dr. Gabriël A. Moens and Professor Dr. Danture



Wickramasinghe led an intensive workshop on Publishing in High-Impact ISI Journals, equipping attendees with practical strategies for academic success. The session comprehensively addressed: journal selection criteria for ISI/Scopus-indexed publications, pre-submission technical preparation, effective response to reviewer

comments, and essential **publication tools/resources**, while also examining critical **ethical and legal considerations** in scholarly publishing. This masterclass provided researchers with

actionable insights to navigate the complexities of high-stakes academic publishing and enhance their global research visibility.
